WHAT IS CAFF

CAFF's member festivals have worked together for more than thirty years to pioneer a made-in-Canada model unique in the Fringe world. Our festivals are designed to put artists and audiences in direct contact, fostering experimentation and discovery on both sides of the fourth wall.

CAFF TODAY

There are currently 34 members of The Canadian Association of Fringe Festivals including 11 members in the United States. Canada now enjoys more Fringe Festivals than any other country in the world and each festival is a leader in the development of theatre artists and audiences in its community.

Collectively, CAFF festival audiences are a boon for independent artists. In the last 3 years alone, they have generated more than \$10,000,000 in box office revenues, returned directly to our artists.

A LONG HISTORY

The first Canadian Fringe was the Edmonton Fringe Festival, established in 1982. Inspired by the Edinburgh Festival Fringe, which began in 1947, the success and growth of Edmonton's adapted formula soon led to the creation of Fringe Festivals across Canada and the United States. Each festival evolved its own flavour to match the distinct personality of its home city, yet each remained dedicated to the Fringe philosophy of accessible, inexpensive and fun theatregoing.

FRINGE IDEALS

The Canadian Association of Fringe Festivals was formed to protect these four guiding principles, still in place today:

- Participants will be selected on a non-juried basis, through a first-come, first served process, a lottery, or other method approved by the Association.
- The audience must have the option to pay a ticket price, 100% of which goes directly to the artists.
- Fringe Festival producers have no control over the artistic content of each performance. The artistic freedom of the participants is unrestrained.
- Festivals must provide an easily accessible opportunity for all audiences and all artists to participate in Fringe Festivals.

FRINGE MANDATE

In 1994, the Canadian Association of Fringe Festivals was officially registered as a non-profit organization with the following mandate:

- To safeguard the integrity of Fringe Festivals as outlined in the four minimum criteria.
- To recognize that the health of all member Festivals is important to the Circuit and therefore the artists' health as a whole.
- To encourage communication and cooperation between member Festivals thereby fostering the continuity of our guiding principles.

Fringe and Fringe Festival are registered trademarks of the Canadian Association of Fringe Festivals (CAFF) and cannot be used without expressed written permission from the Association. This trademark allows CAFF to ensure that any theatre festival in Canada that wishes to call itself "Fringe" must abide by the CAFF mandate and the four guiding principles.

FOR ARTISTS

The Fringe provides an unequaled opportunity to bring to light new and innovative works or rarely staged classics. It is also a forum for local artists to mingle and exchange ideas with members of the national and international theatre community. For many groups, the Fringe has brought overnight success with productions being scouted and remounted by numerous established companies such as Mirvish Productions, The World Stage Festival, Magnetic North, and the High Performance Rodeo. Fringe artists have also gone on to win numerous prestigious awards such as the Chalmers Award, the Governor General's Award for Theatre and Tony Awards.



FOR AUDIENCES

The Fringe is a unique and exciting menagerie of drama, comedy, musical theatre, clown, dance, and multimedia works. A place of discovery and invention, Fringe audiences also have the unique opportunity to interact with Fringe artists and to share their thoughts about the performances while on the festival site. Fringe audiences are encouraged to spread the word about the great shows they have discovered and post reviews for others to read and consider when planning what shows to see. Typically, it is the audience's positive word of mouth that has propelled productions to sold-out runs at Fringe Festivals across the continent.

The Canadian Association of Fringe Festivals was formed to protect these five guiding principles:

HOW TO FRINGE?

So much to see and do...

Make the most of your Fringe experience with these suggestions:

- 1. START AT HALIFAXFRINGEFESTIVAL, CA to check out everything that's on offer!
- 2. STAY INFORMED. Between the Festival Guide, our website, and social media (Facebook: Halifax Fringe Festival; TikTok: @halifaxfringe: Instagram: @halifaxfringefestival), you'll know everything we know.
- 3. TAKE A CHANCE. The wonder of the Fringe is that you never really know what you're going to see. The most talked about shows may not be your cup of tea, and the hidden gems can sometimes be the most fun. Make sure you chat up your neighbour in line or the artist at the bar to uncover that buried treasure. Know your neighbourhood once you've created your list of plays to attend, check our venue map to find each theatre and site–specific location. There's limited parking around many Fringe sites, so we suggest you walk, cycle, or use public transit. Volunteer with us for a free transit pass for the duration of the festival.
- **4. BOOK EARLY.** Tickets are extremely limited. So head over to halifaxfringefestival.ca and get your tickets now. Book early $\mathcal B$ stay dramatic!
- **5. STAY SAFE!** Masks aren't mandatory for all performances, but every show has at least one mask-mandatory performance. Visit our website for a list of all masked performances! Please respect when the performance requests masks. You are welcome to wear a mask any time at the festival!

WANT TO TAKE PART IN 2026?

2026 will mark the 36th anniversary of the Halifax Fringe Festival. The Fringe has taken place each and every year in Halifax since 1990. It always has been and always will be an entirely open access festival which means that absolutely anyone can stage a show or event. COVID GUIDELINES FOR THE 35TH ANNUAL HALIFAX FRINGE FESTIVAL

TICKET AND VENUE INFORMATION

WHERE DO I BUY TICKETS?

Online! All tickets for the 35th Annual Halifax Fringe Festival are available to purchase through https://www.halifaxfringefestival.ca/

CAN I PURCHASE TICKETS IN PERSON?

Yes! The Main Festival Box Office (Neptune Theatre's Scotiabank Lobby) will be open 4-10 PM Mon-Fri (with the exception of Labour Day) and 12-11 PM Sat-Sun.

Each venue's box office will open 15 minutes before the performance.

IS THERE A FEE FOR PURCHASING TICKETS?

Yes, all tickets include a fee. This includes provincial taxes, credit card fees, and administration fees (which go towards keeping the festival going). The administration fee is \$1.00 which has been included in the ticket price. However, the artist determines their base ticket price and they receive 100% of their sales! It is the same price to buy tickets online as it is in person. Thank you in advance for your understanding!



WELCOME TO THE 2025 HALIFAX FRINGE FESTIVAL



The Halifax Fringe Festival takes place in Mi'kma'ki: the traditional, unceded territory of the Mi'kmaw people. While this land acknowledgement is entirely symbolic in its nature, I ask you to reflect on the true action and movements happening on this land around us. Please take a moment to reflect on the space you occupy and how we work towards reparations.

Welcome to the 2025 Halifax Fringe Festival! It is with mixed emotions that I announce that this is my last festival as Executive Director. I have had a wonderful three years connecting with audiences and artists and hearing about what makes them passionate. The fringe creates a space for everyone, which is what drove me to this festival in the first place. I am beginning a new chapter where I will be blending my passion for engaging with young artists, accessibility, and community. The fringe has been a valuable part of my life and it will continue to be. With many colleagues, friends, and chosen family stemming from this festival, I am an avid supporter of local artists creating the work that continues to drive passion into our communities.

Where is my dollar going and who or what is my money actually supporting?" This thinking has changed the places I shop, the banks I use, the movements I support, the art I engage with and create. I hope the fringe movement can offer you similar moments of reflection.

The Halifax Fringe is in good hands. With a passionate board and a loving community behind it, I am positive that it will thrive in its newest iteration. As you take in the art and a momentous year for a long running festival, I also encourage you to connect with those around you. Connecting with others is my favourite part of the whole festival. There is nothing better than sitting in a room and taking in art with other people. I hope you can enjoy every minute of that.

Drawing from the radical visions of Antonin Artaud, *Trans-Sensory Cruelty* plunges into a neurodiverse exploration of performance beyond the division of the senses. Developed through music theatre, research-creation, and experimental technical set design, this work breaks through language and reason, forging a visceral, trans-sensory experience where sound, gesture, and perception dissolve into each other and co-mingle. Interwoven within the piece are moments from musicals by creators like Sondheim that gesture toward neurodiverse ways of being. Through engagement with these pieces, we explore the thresholds of musical theatre—where its eventing-bodying spills over into something else entirely. Rooted in the raw immediacy of Artaud's "Theatre of Cruelty" and neurodiverse modes of sensing, the performance invites audiences to experience more-than-human collective creation as rupture, as emergence, as invocation. A performance not to be understood but to be felt—bodily, painfully, beautifully.




